

Tenth in a Series Finished Quilt: 81"x94"



# CUTTING

**Note:** The following cutting instructions are written for piecing this project without a moda kit. If you are using moda Kit 46140 please refer to only the cutting directions highlighted in red. The fabrics for the stars, alternate blocks and corner squares have been precut and labeled.

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Important: Label and sort the various parts as they are cut.

# FABRICS FOR STARS (PRE CUT STRIPS IN KIT)

Cut  $2 - 2\frac{1}{2}$ " xWOF strips for star blocks

### Fabrics 6 – 28 are for Star Blocks

Refer to the chart on right to determine the number of  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " xWOF strips to cut from each fabric.

Total needed: 42 assorted strips including strips from Fabrics 2 & 3.

### CONSTRUCTION

Note bkgd. pieces are slightly oversized to allow for squaring pieced blocks.

Pair 2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" strips right sides together. Make 21 pairs. Refer to chart below for pair combinations. Pairs in red (1,2, 4, 9, & 14) are used twice – once for whole blocks and once for Star Setting Triangles (half blocks). Pairs in blue (16) is used only as Star Setting Triangles (half blocks).

Note: Like fabric pairs are used in each block. Do not mix and match.

Using the enclosed template cut 8 diamond pairs from each set of strips.

#### CONSTRUCTION – CONT.

## Making a Block – Make 30 whole and 22 half blocks

1. Stitch 2 diamond pairs together. Be sure to stop 1/4" from end of seam. Press seam. Repeat with second set of pairs.

> **2.** Join two halves together. Press center seam open to flatten center.

## Add Background Pieces to Block – Use Y seam

- For each whole block you will need  $4-3\frac{3}{4}$ "x $3\frac{3}{4}$ " corner squares (A) and  $4-5\frac{1}{2}$ "x $5\frac{1}{2}$ " quarter cut triangles (B).
- For each half block you will need  $1-3^{3}/4$  "x $3^{3}/4$ " corner square (A) and  $2-5\frac{1}{2}$ "x $5\frac{1}{2}$ " quarter cut triangles (B) and  $2-4\frac{1}{4}$ "x $4\frac{1}{4}$ " half square triangles (C).
- For each pieced corner triangle you will need 1-51/2"x51/2" quarter cut triangle (B) and 2-4¼ "x4¼" half square triangles (C).
- 1. With right sides together pin corner of square at diamond V-matching seams.
- 2. Then pin outside corner of side setting triangle at diamond point. The "ear" of the triangle will extend beyond edge of square.
- 3. Stitch from center outward.

Make 30

- 4. Pivot corner block, pin second corner and stitch again from center outward. Press.
- 5. Repeat Steps 1-4 to set in corner squares.

# Square Up Blocks

After pressing, square up blocks to measure 10"x10" with seams. Take care to leave a  $\frac{1}{4}"$  seam allowance beyond each diamond point.

Leave <sup>1</sup>/4" seam allowance when squaring whole block

Leave  ${}^{1\!\!/}_{\!\!\!\!\!}$  seam allowance when squaring up corners and setting star triangles.

# CONSTRUCTION – ALTERNATE BLOCKS

Each Square in a Square Alternate Block requires  $1 - 10" \times 10"$  Fabric 2 or 3 background square and  $4 - 5\frac{1}{4}" \times 5\frac{1}{4}"$  Fabric 4 corner squares. Make 21 with Fabric 2 background and 21 with Fabric 3 background.

- 1. Using a mechanical pencil, draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of all 5" x5" corner squares.
- 2. With right sides together align edges of 5" x5" square and a background square. Note direction of marked line.
- 3. Stitch on marked line.
- 4. Trim away middle triangle of fabric leaving a <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" seam allowance. *See diagram*. Press triangle toward corner.
- 5. Repeat on all corners to make one alternate block.

Trim away middle triangle of fabric leaving a 1/4" seam allowance



6. Square up all alternate blocks to measure 10"x10" with seams.

Square in a Square Alternate Blocks Make 21 with Fabric 2 and 21 with Fabric 3

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Dark - Make 21 Light - Make 21 Blocks should measure 10"x10" with seams

## Assemble Quilt

This quilt is pieced on the diagonal. For best results and to avoid confusion, we suggest that you lay out quilt before assembling rows. Refer to quilt image for star block (color) placement. There are 12 rows. See list below for number of units for each row. Note: The setting star units (half blocks) and the Pieced Corner Triangle units are slightly oversized.

#### Always press seams toward alternate blocks.

- Row 1: 2 Setting Star Units, 1 light Alternate Block.
- Row 2: 2 Setting Star Units, 2 dark Alternate Blocks, 1 Star Block.
- Row 3: 2 Setting Star Units, 3 light Alternate Blocks, 2 Star Blocks.
- Row 4: 2 Setting Star Units, 4 dark Alternate Blocks, 3 Star Block.
- Row 5: 2 Setting Star Units, 5 light Alternate Blocks, 4 Star Block.
- Row 6: 1 Setting Star Unit, 6 dark Alternate Blocks, 5 Star Block.
- Row 7: 1 Setting Star Unit, 6 light Alternate Blocks, 5 Star Block.
- Row 8: 2 Setting Star Units, 5 dark Alternate Blocks, 4 Star Block.
- Row 9: 2 Setting Star Units, 4 light Alternate Blocks, 3 Star Block.
- **Row 10:** 2 Setting Star Units, 3 dark Alternate Blocks, 2 Star Block.
- Row 11: 2 Setting Star Units, 2 light Alternate Blocks, 1 Star Block.
- Row 12: 2 Setting Star Units, 1 dark Alternate Block.







Press seams open. Fold prepared strip in half wrong sides together and press to make the binding.

A special note about the binding...the binding on the

antique quilt is a narrow brown twill tape. We have cut our binding a bit narrower in an effort to reproduce the look of the original antique binding.

Layer, quilt and bind.
